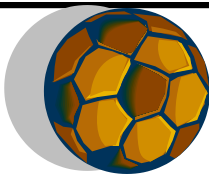

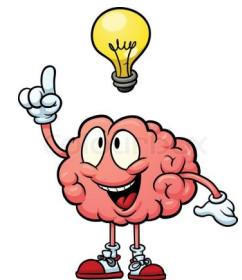

Year 1/2
