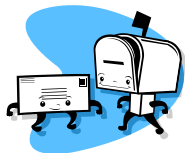


Free School Meals

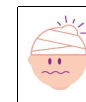

Early Years

We have begun this half term by joining in with the whole school imagination week including a visit from a tortoise called Steve. After this the children will be continuing cross curricular work on the theme of Fairy Tales. The children are doing really well with the nursery rhyme challenge.

Year 1/2

Year 3/4

We have a busy half term. The pupils are working with community gardeners to consolidate their learning about different soils. There is a trip planned to Longdendale Environmental Centre in the Peak District to consolidate their learning about Mountains. All the pupils are looking forward to book week and enjoying their reading.

Year 5/6

We are carrying on with our 'Natural Disasters' topic this term. Please can you ensure pupils wear black shoes for school as a number of 5/6 children were wearing brightly coloured trainers towards the end of last half term.
