Afterschool clubs continue to run this half term, there will be no clubs week beginning Monday 13th July.

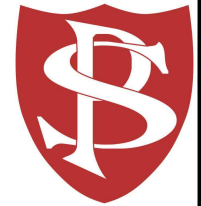

An update from Ms Sorohan

Welcome back to the final half term of this school year. There will be lots of opportunities for you to join celebrations of our children's work and the school. It will be lovely to see you all at our 'Wild about our school' morning, the School Fete and also our open afternoon where you will be able to collect your child's end of year report. Attendance

From September the government are bringing in a further challenge for school attendance by raising the level at which a child is deemed persistently absent to include all pupils whose attendance is 90% or less in a bid to further raise standards. In real terms a child who misses 19 or more days over an academic year will be classed as persistently absent. Over a five year period a child whose attendance is at 90% will miss a quarter of a school year, that's a lot of lost education. At St Paul's we will continue to support all our parents to ensure their children attend school regularly. If you have any concerns please contact myself or Mrs Crewdson through the school office.

PayPal

We are endeavouring to become a cashless office. If you can pay for school dinners via our website and PayPal that would be very much appreciated. We have had lots of positive feedback from parents already using this facility. Please give it a try and get log-in details from the school office. Early Years
