## What process was followed?

- 1. A provision map was made that tracked what each child additionally received during the academic year and was used to ensure all pupils had interventions and were being given opportunity to reach their full potential.
- 2. Pupils were tracked termly to identify which pupils were not in line with national average and their peers, this was used to ensure the gap is not increasing and that it is narrowing.
- 3. Pupils that were not on track were identified and strategies were put in place to give every opportunity for progress. The strategies were chosen through discussions with child's class teachers and the pupils so the best approach was taken making sure that personalised leaning was in place.

## Key successes

#### Mad science

All pupils in year 2,3,4 and 5 were invited to take part in a science club with a practical element.

Of 39 pupils invited 34 attended regularly.

Pupil voice feedback was very positive and many of the pupils attitude to school changed and for a large number of pupils, particularly their confidence in their own ability in class. Evidence was collected through teacher feedback and pupil voice activities.

#### Lunchtime clubs

Year 1/2 Confidence building Four pupils from year 1/2 had been identified as not progressing were invited to join the club once each week to raise their own confidence in school.

Year 5 Super star writers All year 5 girls who were eligible met weekly and created their own creative writing journal. The club was designed to raise self esteem and attainment in Literacy as it was identified as an area for their development. Year 5/6

Creative writing club - 12 pupil premium pupils attend.

#### Skills for life

Pupils were targeted to attend the club that is designed to raise pupils self esteem and organizational skills.

The club ran after school once a week and on 5 Saturdays 8 pupil premium pupils were involved.

## TA support

Every child receives targeted TA support during their week through clear differentiation in class and work is specifically targeted to pupils needs. Pupils at St Paul's receive high quality support which increases confidence, enjoyment and in turn ensures achievement and attainment is maximised.

#### One to one tuition

Pupils who had not received one to one in either year 4, 5 or 6 previously and who were identified as not progressing were targeted for one to one provision.

Individual programs were designed and pupils met each week with a teacher for 1 hour. Pupils were given detailed feedback and personalised homework in order to meet their full potential.
